This year, **19** graduate & post-graduate volunteers visited **930 Grade 10-12** students across the GTA to talk about the history of stem cells, stem cell ethics, and their experiences with stem cell research.



Immunology Day is a collaboration between the Department of Immunology, SciChat, and Let's Talk Science at the University of Toronto (St. George). Together, we celebrate World Immunology Day (April 29th) to raise awareness about the basics of immunology and cutting-edge research done both locally and internationally. This year, **27 volunteers** from the Department of Immunology visited **14 high school classes (Grade 11-12)** throughout the day to deliver workshops related to the immune system and diagnostic techniques.








Each year, we continue a tradition of collaborative outreach with the Sandy Lake First Nation community. A dedicated team of volunteers, in partnership with community leaders, develops and/or modifies tailored, hands-on activities that fit a theme determined through a needs-based assessment each year. Feedback from the community is collected for consideration in future years.

This year, the team created programming for a week-long summer camp (to be held in August 2018), including activities addressing ecology, nutrition, anatomy, and wellness. Volunteers also visited FNMI schools in the Greater Toronto Area in preparation for the onsite visit to Sandy Lake. We anticipate reaching approximately 50 students between the ages of 5 and 10 (Grades 1-5) and will be sending 3 volunteers to the Sandy Lake First Nation community to facilitate the 2018 summer camp!
